

## VISIT TO ZOTTEGEM

## REPORT

In January, 2020, as a participant of the ERASMUS+ Hum@net Project and member of the Hungarian team of four students and two teachers, I had the opportunity to visit a most hospitable and in many ways unique junior high school in Belgium, Koninklijk Atheneum Zottegem.

From the moment of our arrival and until the very end of our five-day-long stay, while participating in most fascinating programmes, we enjoyed the warmest reception from our hosts.

Not only did we get a glimpse into the everyday life of the school, we also had a chance to visit Brussels, the city of historical and cultural importance, where we discovered the world of the Parliamentarium, and then, a couple of days later, take a train to Ghent and browse the streets of the marvellous place sometimes called by visitors the Venice of the Flemish Region.

Among the colourful events and the many workshops of the mobility our hosts engaged us in, the most instructive ones were those which provided us with guidance and practice in the areas of IC technology and its adaptation in classroom environment.

We were given first-hand experience how to incorporate Moovly, Edmodo, Edpuzzle, Classkick or Tinkercard in our everyday life, we gained insight into how to utilize digital arts in different lessons and we even joined a 3D Google expedition.

Those were not the only benefits of the co-operation though. A familiar, yet in many ways different and alluring world of studies has opened up before the eyes of our students. Having exchanged our views on the intriguing issues and challenges of school life, both from students' and teachers' side, having learned some exquisite techniques of school management, we returned to Hungary enriched and charged with plenty of new ideas.
